n October 10, 2023, Texarkana College (TC) held the grand opening of the Dr. James Henry Russell STEM Complex. The naming of the complex is a well-deserved honor, as James Henry Russell (JHR) has spent his life endeavoring to make Texarkana the best place to live, work, and raise a family. It was a day full of celebrating Texarkana College's beautiful state-of-the-art complex and the amazing opportunities available for TC students. After graduating from Texas A&M University-

College Station, JHR turned down a job offer in New York State and returned to Texarkana. After earning his Certified Public Accounting (CPA) license while working at Thomas & Thomas, CPAs, he started a career focused on public education. JHR served over 25 years in education, including 19 years at Texarkana Independent School District (TISD) and six years as president of Texarkana College.

JHR is a role model who does not ask anyone to do something he would not do himself. During his first day at TISD in 1994 as food service comptroller, he found himself wearing a hairnet and working in the school cafeteria because the district had just started a new electronic lunch pay system. He experienced firsthand the importance of the food service workers and all employees who make sure children are ready to learn. JHR has the gift of leadership, making sure everyone knows his appreciation for the important jobs they do.

During the grand opening of the James Henry Russell Stem Complex, George Moore, Vice-President of the Texarkana College Board of Trustees, spoke about the character and integrity



Dr. Donna McDaniel, former Vice President of Instruction at Texarkana College, and current Superintendent of DeKalb Independent School District, said, "When making a big decision, I think to myself, 'What would JHR do?' He is the model of leadership and strives for excellence in every single thing he does."

JHR believes in the power of education to change lives and in ensuring that everyone in our community experiences the highest quality Kindergarten through grade 12 education and goes on after high school to earn a certificate or degree. One of his mantras is "Make it happen," as he personally has devoted his life to making remarkable things happen in Texarkana and the surrounding communities.

In 2011, JHR accepted the position as the eighth president of TC during a time when the historical college needed him most. TC was facing a financial crisis, and without reform, the college would have had to shut its doors. He knew it would take the support of the entire community to save the college. Seeking a mentor to help him guide the institution back to financial solvency, he

reached out to one of TC's most iconic and successful alumnus, Texarkana native H. Ross Perot. During this critical time of institutional transformation, Perot encouraged JHR to launch a community challenge to expand the TC taxing district, which would provide a sustainable source of revenue for years to come. The community rallied in support, responded to the challenge, and voted to annex all of Bowie County into TC's taxing district. Because of these steps and the unwavering dedication of TC's faculty and staff to keep student success their focus, the institution has not only flourished financially, but student completion measures have been at an all-time high, receiving national and state-level recognition.

In 2019, JHR retired from his career in education to begin working in the private sector, currently working as the Senior Vice President and CFO at The Arnold Companies. Although he has taken on new roles, he remains committed to the Texarkana community through his involvement in area organizations, including AR-TX REDI, Boy Scouts of America Caddo Area

Council, Texarkana College Foundation, Ark-La-Tex 100 Club, and as head usher at Williams Memorial United Methodist Church.

One of JHR's legacies to TC was to encourage continuous improvement of campus operations, facilities, and student success. Dr. Catherine Howard, Dean of STEM at TC. explained that before JHR left as president, he ensured that faculty would be included in the planning and implementation of the STEM building project (which is uncommon at other higher education institutions). In June 2018, the TC STEM faculty was invited to tour various campuses across the state to get ideas, inspiration, and take notes on best practices for this project. They looked for things like microbiology lab vent types, chemistry bench configurations, types of plumbing needed, the safest gas systems to have, shelving for backpacks, chair heights, fume hoods, vented chemical storage, and lab classroom furniture arrangements. Every detail of the STEM complex was personally influenced by TC's STEM division faculty.

The STEM Complex design and construction was challenging because it included remodeling and redesigning four buildings from the 1960s. Architect David Lamb masterfully integrated the needs of students and faculty into a new complex that includes

a biology building, chemistry building, math building, and a beautiful atrium with spacious study areas for students. The STEM Complex has 11 state-of-the-art labs, 12 classrooms, 21 offices, three faculty workrooms, and three student lounge areas, totaling 60,882 square feet. It also includes all brand-new equipment, such as autoclaves, ovens, water baths, models, probes, etc. Beautiful artwork is displayed throughout the complex, representing the unique elements associated with STEM.

On the first day of fall classes, TC students walked through the full complex for the first time with wide eyes focused on the grandeur of the buildings, grinning earto-ear at the special details displayed all throughout the complex. Savannah Murphy, TC Student Government Association President, and biology major, said, "As a biology major, I've spent most of my days at TC in the STEM area. I had already fallen in love with the artwork and themes throughout the biology and chemistry buildings, and the atrium connector is stunning to me, different from the rest. The architecture and natural light the ceiling provides is inspiring and motivating. It acts as the perfect resource to supplement my studies and time spent in science at TC."
