EQUIPPED

RIFLES AND FLAGS—essential elements of color guard performances, adding visual interest, technical complexity, and artistic expression, while enhancing the overall impact and storytelling of the performance.

COLOR GUARD MARCHING BAND

GEARED UP

FEATHERED HATS—these iconic hats add height, strength, and flair with colorful plumes that helps members stand out even when performing in large stadiums.

WHITE GLOVES—worn by drum majors as a symbol of leadership. The contrast of the white gloves against otherwise dark uniforms makes hand movements more distinguishable from a distance.



PREPPED & READY

POM-POMS—used for emphasis of movement, drawing the spectator's eye, often with bright color, sparkle and their unmistakable rustling sound.

BOWS—a traditional, attention-catching accessory that helps cheerleaders stand out and adds to the uniformity of the squad.

MEGAPHONES—used to amplify and project voices, making it easier for cheerleaders to connect with and engage crowds.

DECKED OUT

HATS—signature sequined hats and hatbands enhance visual appeal, create a polished look, and increase visibility as they sparkle under the Friday night lights.

BOOTS—a symbol of tradition and discipline, wearing boots is a nod to the history and heritage of drill teams and reflects the dedication and unity of the team members as well as highlights the full extension of highkicks.

FRINGE—adds movement, texture, and flair to the uniforms, making them eye-catching and visually appealing. As performers move and dance, the fringe sways and shimmers, creating a dynamic and captivating effect that can help draw the audience's attention and enhance the overall presentation.
